Waste Not was born in 1987 from one woman's simple yet profound observation. She saw perfectly good food being discarded, while just steps away, people in need went hungry. What began as a small effort to bridge that gap has grown into a powerful movement with a clear mission: to put a stop to food waste and feed our community.

For the past 37 years, that spark of kindness has fueled our journey. Today, Waste Not partners with over 55 food donors and delivers fresh food to more than 85 nonprofit organizations across Maricopa County. By keeping food out of landfills and placing it into the hands of those who need it most, we're helping people and the planet flourish.



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


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DELIVERING MORE THAN MEALS

Waste Not partners with Native American Connections across five locations, supporting their vital work in providing shelter, healthcare, addiction recovery, and nourishment for thousands of Arizonans in need. Over the past year, we've delivered enough fresh food to provide 131,918 meals to the residents of Native American Connections. Together with Native American Connections, we're not just offering meals—we're delivering hope, healing, and a path toward brighter futures for some of the most vulnerable members of our community.


PEOPLE IMPACTED


In 2023-2024, we provided **2.7 million meals** worth of food to our community.

Some of the most vulnerable in our community are facing harsh realities. **89% of the population our agency partners serve, live at or below the 138% Federal Poverty Level.**

This chart shows the population served by the number of agencies.






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A BEACON OF HOPE

In 1998, Diane Silk, then living at a domestic violence shelter, found hope in the fresh food Waste Not delivered. That simple act of nourishment during a difficult time became a lifeline for her. Twenty-five years later, Diane remains profoundly impacted by Waste Not's mission. Grateful for the help she received, she's now giving back to the community that once supported her as a member and volunteer at Hope Lives-Vive La`Esperanzã.

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IT'S A TEAM EFFORT

Huddle up! This year, Waste Not has embraced the excitement around sports and scored big for our community. We've rescued over 43,000 pounds of fresh and prepared food from major events like the World Series at Chase Field, the WM Phoenix Open, and the Final Four at State Farm Stadium. These ready-to-eat meals and pre-cooked food are a game-changer, especially for those without access to fully-equipped kitchens, providing immediate nourishment where it's needed most.

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MEALCONNECT

MealConnect is an app that connects food donations to nearby agencies in need. Primarily ran and operated by volunteers, MealConnect helps Waste Not capture sporadic or one-time food donations that are not a part of our regular routes.



21,614 Pounds

We collected enough pounds of food to provide over 20,000 meals in the last year.

44 Active Volunteers

We could not capture this extra excess food without our team of volunteers who very literally drive out hunger.



304 Connections made

This is the number of times our app was used in the past year with successful pick up and drops offs by our volunteers.

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2,035

metric tons of CH4 (methane) reduced in the last year. That's the equivalent of keeping 484 cars off the road for a year.

332

million gallons of water conserved. This amount of water could fill up 503 Olympicsized swimming pools!

FOOD RESCUE IS A CLIMATE SOLUTION
